## Goal 2: Target 2.A:

Ensure that, children everywhere, boys and girls alike, will be able to complete a full course of primary schooling

# School integration

This project aims to support children with learning difficulties in EB4 and EB8 classes. Implemented in 16 public schools, “school integration” is not only an educational support program; it works on developing children’s social skills and introduces them to citizenship values. The project offers as well counseling to students, in order to facilitate their school integration, hence prevent them from dropping out of school.

### Success and achievements

After implementing this project for three years, Mouvement Social was able to support 1900 children in EB4 & EB8 classes. 65 % of them succeeded and

12% were able to raise their grade point average with two points.

### Developing skills

Since 2007, Mouvement Social worked with 1559 students in citizenship clubs. The association’s team was able to help children express themselves, manage anger, learn collaboration, positive communication and develop many other skills... Children managed to set their priorities and worked on implementing projects to improve life in their schools. Students solicited private sector, school’s administrations & municipalities’ involvement in these projects. The children pursued their projects during summer schools... This activity was held

for three years in a row and hosted 2992 students of different ages.

### Pedagogical experience

Mouvement Social worked on approaching school drop-out problem in a comprehensive manner. The association solicited municipalities’ involvement... supported the elections and initiatives of parents’ committees. Mouvement Social coordinated as well with civil society and educational institutions. The association presented all its pedagogic practices to the ministry of education and to different stakeholders, in order to advocate for a national action plan to prevent school drop- out.

# Pre-professional clubs

These clubs offer alternative education to children aged between 11 and 14 years old, and who dropped out of school or never had the chance to attend it. Mouvement Social hosts children in 4 of his centers. PPC are located in highly deprived areas, in the following regions: Sin El Fil, Tripoli, Zahlé-Kfarzabad and Jnah.

### Integrated follow-up

The Pre-Professional clubs (PPC) hosted 94 children during 2009. A team of educators, counselors and trainers worked with those children to develop their capacities and skills. This program takes into consideration individual needs of each child and offers literacy lessons, basic education: languages and calculus.

Children enrolled in PPC were able to use what they learned in their daily life, they also wrote narrative essays, using description and story elements.

Mouvement Social introduced PPC children to 4 jobs, through interactive activities, and visits to the work places. Children became more aware of the types of jobs most likely to be available in the future, taking into consideration their capacities, capabilities and their environment. 17 children followed a vocational training at Mouvement Social after completing PPC program. Furthermore, the association organizes entertaining activities for PPC children and offers them psychological support, social and family follow-up.

### Education & Entertainment

Mouvement Social's team works on developing the child's personality, his creativity and intellectual skills. It uses drawing, do it yourself crafts, theatre and many educational activities to teach children basic social principles such as: dialogue, communication, non-violence, respect for difference...These activities increase children's self-confidence, and their ability to express themselves. It's an effective way to help them get over their difficult environment, and start thinking about a brighter future.

# After school: Education & Entertainment

This project offers educational and social support as well as counseling for children aged between 7 and 18 years old. Our centers in Jnah and Sin el Fil were founded in a difficult environment, to give children in such areas a place where they can meet on daily basis. In these centers children get tutoring and the necessary help to do their homework.

### **Educational & social aspect**

During one year, Mouvement Social hosted 337 students in Sin el Fil's center and 196 in Jnah's center. The association's team organized several awareness and orientation meetings for parents; it also offered social support for 231 families. 138 children benefited from group counseling or one on one meeting.

Counseling sessions helped children gain more self-confidence and made them aware of their capacities and ability to make a change in their society.

### **Children in the kindergarten**

Mouvement Social's kindergarten in Jnah, is a space reserved for little children to draw them away from their difficult environment, into a world where they can hold on to their little dreams. Mouvement Social's kindergarten hosted 44 children compared to 32 last year. A team of educators and counselors supports those children, and works on developing their skills and knowledge. The team takes into consideration physical, psychological and mind abilities of the little children and prepares them before going to school.

### **Day Camp and other activities**

Mouvement Social organizes many entertaining and pedagogical activities all year round. Children benefit from theatre classes, do it yourself crafts, drawing and field trips...They celebrate together different occasions. Day Camp is one of those activities that offer children an entertaining environment where they can get acquainted with citizenship values. They are made aware of different issues such as: respecting others, respecting the environment, non-violence, dangers of drug addiction, dialogue...7 interns from Medical & Social assistance Faculty participated in the project's activities, as well as 34 volunteers among whom 25 are ladies.

# Vocational training and social rehabilitation

Since its foundation, Mouvement Social paid special attention to youth, and was aware of their effective role in developing their community. The association focused on supporting marginalized young women and men, in order to protect them from exploitation. Vocational training and social rehabilitation ease youth social inclusion and help them access labor market, with necessary professional and social skills.

## Vocational courses and skills development

603 trainees benefited from 52 vocational courses given at Mouvement Social's centers and in "Oasis de l'esperance" vocational center, during the whole year. Young trainees were initiated into different professions such as: assistant cook, assistant videographer, nurse assistant, computer assembly and maintenance,

hairdressing, make-up, electrical technician, marketing, mechanical technician, electronics, pastry, room service and secretariat. Young offenders in Roumieh prison followed vocational trainings and were initiated into the following professions: leatherwork and woodwork, computer assembly and maintenance.

## Social and labor market inclusion

Social rehabilitation courses are an integral part of vocational training. They help trainees develop their personality and make full use of their labor potential. During this year's courses, Mouvement Social tackled new issues such as democracy, citizenship values...this step enhances youth engagement and perseverance. Young trainees follow an internship in one of the companies that agreed to be part of Mouvement Social's

network. At the end of the training course at "Oasis de l'esperance" vocational center, graduates receive certificates from The Directorate General of Technical and Vocational Education. Graduates who followed a vocational training at Mouvement Social's centers receive a certificate from National Employment Office. Through, vocational training & social rehabilitation, Mouvement Social contributed in the labor market inclusion of 42.3% young graduates. Most of them expressed their gratitude for what they have achieved in such a short period.

# Young offenders & women in conflict with the law

Mouvement Social has been working in Roumieh prison since 1994, and in Barbar El Khazen prison since 1998. The program implemented in both prisons is considered as a preparatory rehabilitation phase for prisoners before they rejoin society. Social support, counseling and legal assistance are provided to prisoners, as well as vocational training courses in order to develop their skills, and ease their social inclusion after their release from prison.

## Vocational training and production

164 incarcerated young offenders participated in vocational training courses and were initiated into the following professions: computer assembly and maintenance, hairdressing, leatherwork and woodwork. 65 incarcerated women were initiated into different professions:

computer work, embroidery, hairdressing. Vocational programs had a positive impact on prisoners and many orders were placed at the production workshops, especially from “L’artisan du Liban”. Furthermore and in order to generate an income for the prisoners, Mouvement Social participated in many exhibitions to showcase and sell their work. For this year, every woman and juvenile were asked to make a personal financial file. It was a way to highlight the importance of their work and encourage them to manage their income and spending.

## Social rehabilitation & counseling

Social support and counseling respect every prisoner’s privacy. The association’s team uses different techniques depending on emerging needs of each and every one of the incarcerated individuals; 90 young

offenders and 120 women benefited from this service. Prisoners discussed in group different issues such as: human and child rights, labor law, communication, hygiene, sports, drugs, environment...

## Legal assistance

Mouvement Social offers legal assistance to prisoners such as: legal reviews, joinder of offences, discharge, release... The legal team of the association raises awareness among prisoners about legal procedures, discharge, reduction act law... In some cases Mouvement Social hires a defense lawyer.

## Entertaining activities

Entertainment is an essential part of the rehabilitation process in prison, that’s why Mouvement Social organizes many activities in the prison to help prisoners

express themselves and interact. 69 young offenders participated in the drawing workshop and 45 participated in the theatre workshop. 67 women participated in sports classes, and 120 benefited from the library that Mouvement Social built in Barbar El Khazen prison. Furthermore, prisoners participated in the organization of different events for the holidays or graduation which softened the impact of incarceration on them.

# Social Reintegration

This project is divided into two phases: the preparatory phase inside the prison and the implementation phase as soon as women and juveniles are released. The program includes developing guidelines for a “life project”. Women and juveniles assisted by the association’s team will work on implementing their “life project” in order to reach a full social integration.

## Outline

“What’s the life I want once I am released?” That’s the prominent question that looms large in the prisoners’ minds. They work on finding answers to that question and ways to achieve their plans. “Life project” takes into consideration different elements that are essential to social reintegration such as: family, education, job opportunity, personal skills... Mouvement Social supported 155 juveniles and 48 women

after their release. The association’s action covers the regions of Mount Lebanon, North, Bekaa and Beirut. Follow-up methods included different levels of support: individual, family, social, career and counseling. A comprehensive support is an important mean that encourages juveniles and women to work and facilitates their reintegration.

## Legal assistance and awareness raising

3 legal counseling offices offered their services to 45 women, juveniles and their families with the collaboration of the following municipalities: Bourj El Barajneh, Baalbeck and Tripoli. Mouvement Social raised awareness among 63 companies about their role in preventing recidivism, and boosted them to offer job opportunities to ex-prisoners.

Furthermore the association’s team raised awareness among 169 students as well as different individuals and institutions.

## Activities

Mouvement Social organizes several cultural activities and uses them as therapies such as drama-therapy and therapy through art. Ex-prisoners wrote poetry and stories; they produced voice records and movies...They learned Knitting with wool, handcrafting and participated in many recreational and educational tours. Despite small revenue, being productive gives ex-prisoners a big moral support, and a chance to show the positive changes they made in their lives.

# Community Service

This project is an application of one among many alternative measures for imprisonment.

Community service is a measure stipulated by the Protection of Juveniles law, issued in 2004 - Act No 422. Reference to this law, and in harmony with its commitment to children's rights among which preventing stigmatization of the juvenile, Mouvement Social offers support to young offenders, who have been ordered by the court to serve sentences in the community. Since February 2006, the association has been implementing this project in Beirut, Mount Lebanon, Bekaa & North.

### Action oriented approach

Community service engages young offenders in a wide range of tasks, designed to put something positive

back into the local community or into an authorized institution through unpaid activities. Social workers at Mouvement Social ensure that offenders have a lower chance of re-offending by performing checkups during the rehabilitation process. They agree on a referral order contract with the young person in the presence of different stakeholders. Furthermore, social workers liaise with the authorized institution that will host the young offender. During the rehabilitation process, Mouvement Social offers counseling to juveniles and regularly evaluates their work. Social workers provide reports relevant to the young offenders' case and service to the court. Mouvement Social offered support to 136 juveniles who have been ordered by the court to serve sentences in municipalities, social or medical institutions...

### Cooperation and awareness

Mouvement Social's team visits many organizations and institutions all year through, to raise awareness about community service. The association encourages different stakeholders to work together for the benefit of the juveniles. A network of NGO's and institutions was initiated by Mouvement Social to offer juveniles a place where they can serve their sentences. This network has developed and the number of partners increased: 354 compared to 222 last year.

## Goal 8:

# Volunteers... the core of Mouvement Social

Mouvement Social started as a volunteers' movement. Since its foundation, the association was powered by volunteers, who believed in its principles and worked on developing and improving the society, as well as achieving social justice through projects that target each and every human being.

## Towards development

95 new volunteers joined Mouvement Social, the number increased compared to last year's 66 new volunteers. They came from different Lebanese regions to participate in the association's multiple activities and projects. Volunteers organized "solidarity days", an action that aims to raise awareness among students about a social issue, and keeps them engaged in the development of their community. This year, volunteers tackled

"the right to difference", after following several trainings on: Mouvement social's projects and principles, communication, organizing activities, teamwork, needs assessment, participatory techniques, types of difference, conflict resolution, prejudices, reality of prison life and volunteering... The volunteers participated as well in several external trainings on: world economic crisis and youth role, peer education, anti-corruption strategy, workshops on development of youth policies in collaboration with UNESCO.

## Regional activities

365 young people participated in many activities organized by the volunteers in different Lebanese regions. Raising awareness on the right to difference and citizenship values was the aim of actions such as: a rally paper that took place

in Akkar, and many young people came from Tal Abbas, Tal Meyan, Hrar and Halba to participate in this event. The Volunteers organized similar activities in Jebjenine, Zahle, Atrine, Kfarsir and Kleiaa. The volunteers were also interested in environmental issues; they took part hand in hand with students in a cleaning campaign around the beach area in Saida. Such activities motivate and engage youth, to work and make positive change in their communities. These actions can be a catalyst for dialogue and cultural exchange among different youth groups.

# Development action & advocacy

## Career Fair

### “A future with no limits”

Aiming at expanding the professional horizons of youth, Mouvement Social organized a career fair at the UNESCO palace. The fair hosted more than 20 companies, unions, technical institutes and career counselors. They worked on raising awareness of young people on labor market opportunities and the relevant course of study. They explained to young visitors about the skills required for each job, hence helped them choose a career that meets their qualifications. The fair was also a place where young people were able to find a suitable job at any of the exhibiting companies. Furthermore, exhibitors made it clear to young visitors that education and training are a guarantee of a successful integration in the labor market and crucial

means towards a prosperous future. The Career Fair hosted professionals in the following fields:

Food industry, printing, mechanics, health, fashion design, carpentry and interior design, photography, marketing and advertising, maintenance, information technology, hotel management, agronomy and ticketing.



## “Make a difference”

### Solidarity Days to defend the right to difference

745 students aged between 14 and 16 years old, participated in this event, held in different Lebanese regions to raise awareness about “difference”. Through educational exercises, students were able to discuss the types of difference, the importance of communication and the right to be different. During the event, volunteers presented small plays that raised the issue of difference. 5 types were put under scrutiny: social, regional, gender, physical and racial differences. At the end of the day, students expressed themselves through drawing. Difference was the main subject of their paintings that were hanged on the school walls to remind them of their important role in defending one’s right to difference.

## **Forum: “Education: Reality & Perspectives, educational practices to limit school drop-out”,**

Under the patronage of the minister of education Dr Hassan Mneymneh, Mouvement social organized this forum to present the result of an ongoing work to understand the reasons behind school drop-out and to implement prevention policies. The Forum raised 3 main issues:

### **1- Profiles of children at risk of school drop-out.**

Mouvement Social implemented “School Integration” program in 16 Lebanese public schools. During three years this program helped prevent school drop-out and was a means to study in depth the needs of children with learning difficulties.

### **2- The complementary role of school counseling members.**

Mouvement Social in partnership with the education faculty of AUB is conducting a study on the importance of school counseling including the presence of a

dedicated team that supports children with learning difficulties.

### **3- Prospects for education outside school.**

A procedural study conducted by Mouvement Social in partnership with Université St Joseph, allowed the organization to present different educational practices followed by its team in pre-professional clubs. MS inaugurated those clubs more than 10 years ago to facilitate the integration of school drop-outs in society and in the labor market afterwards.



### **Training for prison guards**

In the framework of the social coordination with the prison administration, Mouvement Social conducted training sessions for guards of Barbar El Khazen, a prison for women. These sessions aimed at developing guards' skills, to facilitate daily contact between them and prisoners. Different subjects were tackled by trainers such as: conflict resolution, psychological and social characteristics of women in conflict with the law, the role of guards and prison security forces, as well as limits of intervention, staging an intervention for drug addicts.

# Media: a strong base for civil society

“Being strong” is a concept that is generally related to a winner/loser situation. It emphasizes the importance of “being in control” no matter how, even if violence is one of the means being employed. On the other hand, civil society and every organization that advocates for human rights consider “Being strong” a concept based on collaboration and coordination to reach their goal. Therefore, efforts are linked together to embed humanitarian and social principles such as: freedom, equality, tolerance and many more principles that show us the true meaning of a human being. At this point, it is important to be thankful for all the efforts media have made to put social issues under scrutiny. Journalists joined forces with Mouvement Social and different civil society entities to advocate for the implementation of policies that take into

account the rights of the underprivileged groups. We wish to thank all media partners for their good cooperation and for considering solidarity as a motivating force.

## Knowledge Solidarity Center

The center is meant to provide research and information support, in order to encourage communication and dialogue among different age groups. Several activities take place in the center such as (movie-club, trainings, and preparations for solidarity days...).

The center combines education with entertainment. It provides an open access to the internet, and a specialized library on civil society and development. The center has well equipped spaces that are available to host meetings and trainings.

## Mouvement Social's publications:

Every year, Mouvement Social publishes reports, studies and audio visual tools to document its experience and share it with different stakeholders. This year, the association has published:

- Minutes of the forum “Education: reality and perspectives-pedagogical practices to limit school drop-out.”
- 8 short documentaries on advocacy work done by students in “citizenship clubs”, a part of “School Integration” program.
- “A future with no limits” manual. It provides career and vocational counseling for youth.



# New Projects

## **Citizenship is my right**

This project aims at strengthening youth participation in local governance and community life. It seeks to prevent rural exodus and encourage young people to remain in their villages. Target groups are youngsters aged between 16 and 20 years old. This project is implemented in 16 Lebanese villages, in collaboration with municipalities. Target groups follow several trainings that will develop their skills and help them collaborate with municipalities. Mouvement Social began the implementation of this project in October 2009. Regions, youth groups and municipalities were chosen based on criteria such as: the region has to be a rural village, municipalities' selection took into consideration Lebanese diversity, and youth groups should be ready to stay in their villages and work on development projects.

## **Protecting children from conflict**

This project aims at safeguarding children's rights as enshrined in international law and conventions, and in particular protecting children in situations of conflict. Mouvement Social began the implementation of this project in November 2009. Two categories are targeted in this project:

### **Children aged between 10 & 14 years old:**

Mouvement Social's team offers those children basic education, and helps them overcome their fears, and traumas through different pedagogical practices. Children are given access to creative workshops and different activities where they can express themselves, and discuss their future plans. They are also initiated to citizenship values and civic participation in four of our centers: Sin El Fil 2, Jnah, Zahle-Kfarzabad and Tripoli.

## **Young leaders aged between 15 and 18 years old:**

Mouvement Social works on developing their skills in positive communication and conflict resolution. Youth groups participate in designing innovative educational material to raise awareness about conflict mitigation. Young people are trained to be mediators in their schools and communities and play an active role in preventing conflicts. Mouvement Social organizes several activities in collaboration with the young leaders in order to raise awareness and debate about conflicts and peace building.
